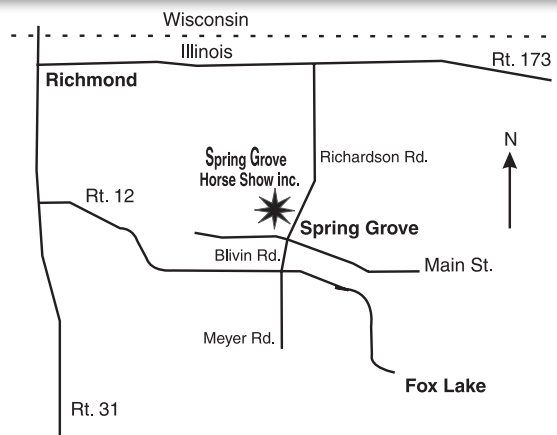
Formal attire not required, however, helmet and boots strongly recommended.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Age as of January 1, 2011

Note: **Denotes timed event

Class 1 - Costume Class - Exhibitor and horse are dressed in creative attire. Horses can be lead.

**Class 2, 3 - Bribe Your Horse - Horse is persuaded (using carrots, grain, apples, etc.) to follow exhibitor (who is on foot) around a barrel placed at the end of arena. Handler cannot touch the horse after passing through the starting line. Bridle/saddle not required. Halter is required.

Class 4, 5 - Bareback Dollar - A dollar bill (bring your own) is placed by the judge under the rider's knee, seat, thigh or calf. This class is run as a typical pleasure class, although other maneuvers may be added. The rider who maintains the dollar in the initial position the longest, wins all the dollars from the other exhibitors. No Chaps allowed.

Class 6 - Tandem Bareback - This class is run as a typical pleasure class, although other maneuvers may be added. Two riders will ride bareback on the same horse, with both riders facing the horse's head. (Riders are not back-to-back.) Extra credit will be given to those dressed alike. Chaps are allowed.

Class 7, 8 - Musical Sacks - Sacks are placed on the ground in a large circle, according to the number of horses entered. For example, if ten horses are entered, nine sacks will be on the circle. Riders are mounted, when the music starts, they trot their horses around the outside of the sacks. When the music stops, riders must dismount and lead their horse forward to the next open sack. You cannot go back to a sack, you must go forward (counterclockwise). The person who does not have a sack is excused and everyone mounts up again, a sack is eliminated, the music starts, the horses start trotting, and the class continues until only one exhibitor is left.

Class 9, 10 - Water Balloon Race - This class is run as a typical pleasure class, although other maneuvers may be added. Each entry will receive a balloon full of water. As the different gaits are performed, balloons will break. The rider with the last balloon at the end of the class is the winner.

**Class 11, 12- Boot Race - Exhibitors remove one boot and have their own volunteer place boot by cone. Exhibitors ride their horse to the boot. Their volunteer holds their horse while rider puts their boot back on and then leads their horse back across finish line.

Class 13, 14 - Egg & Spoon - This class is run as a typical pleasure class, although other maneuvers may be added. Each entry will receive a spoon and an egg. Rider will hold the spoon with the egg in the spoon portion. As the different gaits are performed, the eggs will fall because the rider cannot touch the egg. The rider who retains the egg on the end of the spoon the longest is the winner.

**Class 15, 16 - Texas Flag - Ride around the barrel, pick up the flag and run back.

**Class 17 - Ribbon Race - Pattern will be posted. Pairs run around the barrel holding ribbons.

**Class 18, 19 - Plug Class - Pattern will be posted. Run around the barrel and run back.

**Class 20, 21 - Speed and Action - Pattern will be posted on show day. A sixteen foot square box is marked in the arena. Rider starts in the box and then runs around the barrel at end of the arena. The rider returns to stop in the box and then stay within the box for five seconds. The horse must not step on or over the box line during the five second hold or the rider is disqualified. Appropriate tack required.

**Class 22, 23 - Flag Race - Pattern will be posted.

**Class 24, 25 - Cloverleaf Barrels Race - Pattern will be posted.

**Class 26, 27 - Relay Race - Pattern will be posted on show day. The first entry rides around the outside of three barrels, between the rail and the barrels. The hand-off of the baton to the next rider must occur in the designated hand-off area. Knocking down a barrel, hitting the horse with baton, not completing the hand-off in designated area, crossing through the timer prematurely or dropping the baton is disqualification.

**Class 28, 29, - Scudda Ho - Pattern will be posted on show day. Each entry will weave their horse around four poles, jump a small jump, weave around three barrels, jump the small jump again. The jump in the middle will be set as an "X". If a jump, barrel or pole is knocked down, a five second penalty is incurred. Horse can refuse the jump one time (incurs a five second penalty,) but must go over the second time or the horse is excused.

**Class 30, 31 - Pole Bending - Pattern will be posted.

-No entries accepted after a class has been called.
